What does the concept of *scarcity* mean? Why is the idea of *scarcity* at the heart of economics?

Who makes the *choices*?

Who are the decision-makers within the economy?

There are *costs* associated with every choice:

What are *opportunity costs*?

How do these costs relate to the alternative ways to use a resource? What are the *benefits* of a choice?

Explain how people made their choices:

Was the *market price* the primary determinant of cost/benefit? Did the *government* dictate the choice?

Did the people follow tradition in making their choice?

Why does *trade* happen? What does it mean to say that *voluntary* trade creates wealth?
